We're always looking for good quality items to sell in our shops. You can drop off donations to your local shop, or our Rescue and Rehoming centre, our team are looking forward to your visit.

What you can donate

We accept a wide range of good quality, pre-loved goods and we need over 5000 bags of donations every year. Here's a list of items that you can donate to help us to support our charity:

- Shoes and handbags
- Clothing
- Accessories
- Jewellery
- Bric-a-brac
- DVDs, CDs and Records
- Books
- Children's toys
- Homeware
- Clean bath and hand towels to use in our kennels
 Please make sure that if you are donating items to us, that they are clean and in good working condition.

We try to sell everything that you generously donate to us, but <u>there are</u> <u>some items that we cannot sell</u> for safety or legal reasons. If you're not sure if we can sell your donations, please take a look at our list below.

What you can't donate and why

Safety reasons

We don't sell items that may be dangerous to our staff, volunteers or customers. We also don't sell safety equipment that we can't guarantee is still effective.

Hygiene reasons

We do not sell items that present a hygiene risk in their use or handling. **Legal reasons**

We do not sell items that are legally prohibited from sale. We also do not sell items that need a licence that is either inappropriate or too expensive.

Wellbeing reasons

We do not sell legal items that may cause harm. **Undesirability**

We do not stock items that are unlikely to sell or that would be against our **fundamental principles** if we sold them.

Please do not donate these items. Disposing of them may cost money and divert funds away from animals that need our help:

- Upholstered furniture without a fire label including items without labels that are part of donated sets.
- Upholstered furniture with large tears or damage.
- Furniture with missing parts or damage that may make the item unsafe.
- Veneered wood furniture with damage to the veneer exposing the inner wood.
- Candles without instructions.
- Electric items that produce heat, ie. kettles, toasters, hair tongs etc.
- Electric blankets.
- Electric showers.
- Sunbeds and tanning equipment.
- Waste disposal units.
- Power tools without instructions.
- Gas appliances (mains or bottled).
- Oil filled radiators (not supplied with a thermostat).
- Storage heaters hardwired.
- Buoyancy aids, lifejackets, inflatable dinghies unless new and boxed.
- Safety helmets, riding hats, crash helmets, cycle helmets.
- Safety harnesses of any sort.
- Firefighting equipment.
- Children's car seats.
- Toys without a CE mark.
- Software and hardware.
- Home recorded DVDs, video and audiotapes, computer games and software on recordable CDs and DVDs.
- Weapons, knives, swords, sword stocks, crossbows.
- Guns and ammunition (including replica guns).
- Duvets and pillows that have been used.
- Medication including vitamins.
- Prescriptions spectacles.
- Ivory.
- Petrol or diesel fuelled garden tools such as lawnmowers.
- Real fur items.
